### **Arkansas' Unemployment Rate Declines to 8.2 Percent**

#### **Arkansas Civilian Labor Force Summary:**

Labor force data, produced by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics and released today by the Department of Workforce Services, show Arkansas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point, from 8.3 percent in September to 8.2 percent in October. Arkansas' civilian labor force rose 6,900, a result of 7,500 more employed and 600 fewer unemployed Arkansans. The United States' jobless rate also declined one-tenth of a percentage point, down to 9.0 percent in October.

DWS Communications Director Kimberly Friedman said, "This is the first time Arkansas' unemployment rate has declined since March 2011. The drop in the rate relates to a gain of 7,500 employed, which is the largest monthly employment increase of the year."

#### **Arkansas Nonfarm Payroll Job Summary:**

Arkansas' nonfarm payroll employment rose 3,000 in October to total 1,180,500. Four major industry sectors added jobs, more than offsetting declines in six major sectors. One sector remained the same. **Government** posted the largest increase (+3,800). Most of the gains occurred in local government (+2,500), which continues to reflect seasonal public school employment. **Educational and health services** added 2,100 jobs. The increase was mostly related to jobs in private education. Employment in **professional and business services** rose 1,200. Hiring was spread throughout all three subsectors. Jobs in **construction** declined 1,400, as many businesses finished seasonal projects. **Trade, transportation, and utilities** experienced a decrease of 1,400 jobs, mostly in transportation-

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warehousing-utilities. This industry includes all types of transport, including air, rail, water, truck, and passenger transportation.

Since October 2010, nonfarm payroll jobs in Arkansas decreased 1,200. Two major industry sectors posted job losses, more than offsetting the growth seen in six industries. Three sectors remained the same. Jobs in **manufacturing** decreased 6,400. Most of the drop occurred in nondurable goods manufacturing (-4,000), related to multiple layoffs and business closures. **Trade, transportation, and utilities** posted a decline of 2,900 jobs. A majority of the drop occurred in retail trade (-3,200), partially offset by gains in transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+1,000). **Government** enjoyed the largest annual growth (+4,000), mostly at the local level. Jobs in **educational and health services** rose 1,900. A majority of the increase occurred in heath care and social assistance (+1,500). **Financial activities** added 1,200 jobs, related to expansions in finance and insurance.
