7	WHEREAS, Arkansas's natural gas industry has created thousands of jobs that
8	pay higher than the state average; and
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10	WHEREAS, the development of Arkansas's natural gas industry has positively
11	impacted the state's economy; and
12	WILLEDE AC in 2009 Common Miles Back and Jited Wiles of involved by in-
13 14	WHEREAS, in 2008, Governor Mike Beebe credited "the stimulus being provided by the Fayetteville Shale exploration and production" as a reason why
15	Arkansas had fared better than other states during the country's economic downturn;
16	and
17	
18	WHEREAS, Arkansas's current natural gas severance tax rate is comparable to
19	those of surrounding states; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the natural gas severance tax rate in Arkansas was increased in
22	2008 and those tax collections are up 4000%; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, the increase in the development of shale formations in the United
25	States creates a competitive environment; and
26 27	WHEREAS, according to a recent study by IHS Global Insight, the shale gas
28	industry supported more than 600,000 jobs in 2010 with that number expected to
29	grow to 870,000 by 2015; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, according to the same study, the shale gas industry will generate
32	more than \$933 billion in tax revenues for local, state and federal governments over
33	the next 25 years; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, the proposed Natural Gas Severance Tax Act of 2012 would take
36	hundreds of millions of dollars from the local economies of natural gas producing
37	counties and communities; and
38	WILLEDE AC an analysis all the Engage will clear to the control of
39 40	WHEREAS, nearly all the Fayetteville Shale counties have an unemployment
40 41	rate below the state average; and
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42	WHEREAS, the proposed 7% flat severance tax contained in the Natural Gas
43	Severance Tax Act of 2012 would be among the highest in the country and would
44	threaten Arkansas's ability to compete for natural gas drilling capital and the resulting
45	jobs and economic impact.

47	NOW THEREFORE,

49	BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE FAYETTEVILLE SHALE CAUCUS OF THE
50	EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS
51	OPPOSES THE PASSAGE OF THE NATURAL GAS SEVERANCE TAX ACT
52	OF 2012.
